RE: Farmer Legacy 2020: A Centennial Celebration and Commitment to Action

We would like to bring to the UFC's and all faculty members' attention the important year ahead for the University's commemoration of James Farmer, whose 100th birthday would have been January 12, 2020. President Paino has charged a group of alumni, faculty, staff, and students to *lead efforts to recognize the imprint of Farmer's work as a civil rights activist and educator at the University of Mary Washington. The Council will distinguish Farmer's legacy by showcasing the ways in which UMW advances inclusive excellence and community and civic engagement and by envisioning ways in which to strengthen democratic ideals in our future work and endeavors.*

We write to ask you, as faculty members, to join the commemoration and commitment to action, including the following:

- Consider at least one assignment, project, and/or experiential component for in spring courses that align with Farmer Legacy 2020.
- Consider courses and more of the above for the Fall 2020 that align with Farmer Legacy 2020.
- Take advantage of the Library's wonderful Farmer resources and other resources (see below).
- To stay abreast of communications, programs and events being planned campus -wide by faculty staff and students and be sure to attend or participate whenever you can.
- Share your ideas and any related activities. We plan to provide an online opportunity to do so on the Farmer Legacy 2020 website.
- Commit to one new goal to make learning accessible for all (attend ODR's Accessibility 101; use or create close caption content; check color contrast in digital resources; describe images verbally and in writing, etc.). Contact ODR for assistance.

Dr. Devlin is the chair of the Farmer Legacy Council's subcommittee overseeing this work. She, Sabrina, and Juliette would be happy to come present to the UFC or academic departments about this university-wide commemoration.

Farmer Legacy 2020's official launch will take place in a few weeks; the primary commemoration and commitment to action will occur in the Spring and Fall semesters 2020. A website and brand will be available soon.
