### Minutes of the March 26, 2021 Meeting

The Zoom meeting was called to order at 3:35 p.m. The minutes of the February 4 and February 26 meetings were approved.

#### New Business:

The committee approved a change in the Historic Preservation major to include both GISC 200 and EESC 205 as alternatives to GEOG 250 on the list of elective credits in the major.

The committee approved changes in Leadership and Management Studies (BLS only) to include alternative courses (GISC 200 or GEOG 205 or EESC 205) in a list of electives in the Leadership and Communication category. Two courses (BPST 314 and BPST 471) were also removed from the list of electives as they will no longer be offered.

The committee approved the following new course:

1. ENGL 323: Sexuality and the Origins of Modernity

The committee approved the deletion of a list of courses that have not been taught in five years. This list, together with a description from Kevin Caffrey of the procedure for seeking approval or disapproval of course deletion from chairs of the affected departments, is included on the following pages.
